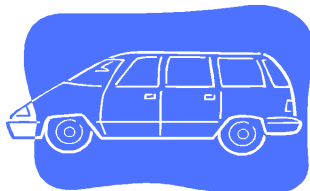
Lost and Found

Maxey Elementary School

Dropping off or picking up children at elementary schools can be very frustrating for parents. The staff at Maxey and the Lincoln Police Department is aware of the problems caused by the large amount of vehicular and pedestrian congestion around the school.

To help alleviate some of the congestion issues, the City's Traffic Engineer's Office has developed recommended one-way drop off and pick up plans that focus on the safety of the students. Maxey Staff are following the traffic plan. Each school has their own specific plan that can be accessed by going online to: <http://www.lincoln.ne.gov/city/pworks/engine/traffic/schools/safety/one-way.htm>

The parking and traffic control signs posted near the school follow the plan and are specifically placed to help traffic flow more efficiently, while making the safety of students the number one priority. In addition to following the recommended one-way traffic directions of the plan, things like not stopping in the traffic lane or in posted no parking zones will help keep all traffic moving more effectively. Parents should always pull into the loading/unloading zone or legally park on an adjacent block to load and unload students.

I am sure that you are concerned about the safety and welfare of children as they go to and from school, as are the members of the Lincoln Police Department and the staff at Maxey Elementary School. By following the plan and working together we can make this another great, safe year at Maxey Elementary School.
